Report on Principles, Spend and Impact of Pupil Premium Grant 2015-2016

Principles

As a Church school our ethos is firmly rooted in gospel values with love being the foundation of everything we do. We recognise that our children are made in the image of God and possess unique gifts and qualities. So:

- We strive to ensure that the impact of our teaching enables all children to make appropriate levels of progress throughout school
- We already target support at all children in need of it in maths and English
- We are aware that not all children who may trigger this grant are in fact disadvantaged
- We are aware that many of our children who are not triggering this grant are disadvantaged as not all who are eligible will claim FSM

Nature of support 2015/16

- Relevant children received full subsidies to enable them to go to residential outdoor activity
- Articles of school uniform subsidised
- Subsidised music lessons for relevant children
- Whole school music tuition given to all children
- Sports trips funded
- Music trips funded
- School trips/visitors to school subsidised
- Learning Mentor salary

Impact of support

- All children who want to go on residential trips are able to go
- All children have appropriate winter clothing

Impact of funding on Progress:

At the end of KS2 the % disadvantaged low, middle and high prior attaining pupils making expected progress in all subjects is broadly average compared to the national picture.

Future Action:

The future allocation of the grant is under review during 2016/17. However, apart from the residential trip to Robinwood, other school visits will not be subsidised. This will mean that more of the pupil premium can be allocated on closing the educational gap for children who are disadvantaged.
